



2020 Rural Health Innovation Challenge Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can individuals register for the RHIC?

Awards will be paid to established organizations, not to individuals. Rural based organizations focused on rural health improvement are eligible to compete. Health care nonprofits and County Health Improvement Organizations (CHIOs) are encouraged to participate.

2. Is attendance at the OK Rural Health Conference and CHIO Annual Meeting required to compete in the RHIC?

Rural health partners from across the state have joined forces to create a phenomenal learning and collaboration experience for professionals committed to improving rural health across Oklahoma. Although not required, we encourage you to make plans to register and attend the Oklahoma Rural Health Conference hosted by the Rural Health Association of Oklahoma and the CHIO Annual Meeting, hosted by the Public Health Institute of Oklahoma. Separate registrations are open for the conference, meeting and RHIC. These opportunities will be a great chance to learn about what is happening across Oklahoma to improve rural health outcomes.
