What is a CHIO and how do we become one?

A CHIO is a certification for your new or existing community-based coalition, the certification process is facilitated by the Public Health Institute of Oklahoma. CHIO certifications are granted to coalitions meeting enhanced standards for collaboration through their collaborative work and strategic alignment of partnerships. Coalitions receiving CHIO certifications utilize their county's health indicators to advance health equity through evidence-based practices and strategies at a local level.

How does CHIO certification benefit your community?

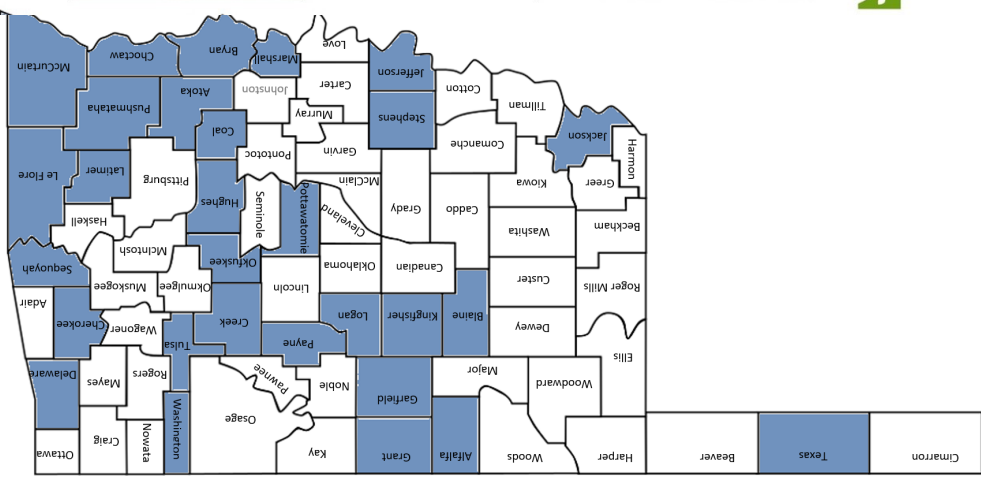
