- Why is the RHIC important?
 - Public Health Institute of Oklahoma and the OSU Center for Health Systems Innovation have invited sponsors to help incentivize community voice with innovative ideas and increase implementation of the OK State Health Improvement Plan and Health Equity Plan. Many state plans collect dust on a bookshelf....this seed-funding will increase engagement and implementation.

 - Rural Health Innovation Challenge will promote ideas of participatory budgeting, community-voice inclusion, and storytelling, especially with populations experiencing health disparities
- What is the RHIC?
 - An opportunity to showcase your innovative idea that addresses a rural health-focused challenge to funders statewide
 - Incentivize local implementation of the <u>OK State Health Improvement Plan</u> (2023-2028) and <u>Health Equity Plan</u>
 - Your organization <u>submits an innovative idea</u> online **before May 31st**
 - If invited, your team competes for funding at an in person event on June 20th in Tulsa
 - Aim is to unlock the innovative potential of frontline rural health providers and improvement agents by awarding the best ideas with seed-funding
 - Connect ideas with potential funders and resources to expand idea
- Additionally, is this funding just for new innovative projects or can it also be used toward existing innovative projects.

- New and established innovation projects are eligible to submit a RHIC proposal. Funding supports innovative <u>enhancements</u> and provides <u>seed-funding</u> to new and established programs, projects, or initiatives. RHIC funding cannot be used to extend existing program activities otherwise funded through another avenue. If you have an established program, you must propose an enhancement to your existing innovation to be considered.
- What will the range of prizes be?

Grand Prize is at least \$10,000 other winners will range from \$1000 - \$5000

- What should the Innovation Pitch cover?
 - Prepare a presentation that lasts no more than 7 minutes. There will be 3 more minutes for Q&A
 - Introduction, state the problem, share your solution, business plan, community resources, and conclusion

What should your Innovation Pitch cover?

	Presentation Components
Presentation	Introduction Quickly Introduce your team Introduce your idea
Need	State the Problem. (Briefly! Give more time to tell about solution than the problem) Quickly state the problem your team is trying to solve? What is the need this problem creates
Potential Impact of Solution	1. State the Solution. What is your solution? Give us a little background on what the product/solution/program does. "This program will give x number of people in our community y" Provide a Product/Solution analysis. How does your solution work? Give us some details of how exactly the solution would work, how it would operationalize and how you developed the idea. Why did you think of this?

What should your Innovation Pitch cover?

Business Plan	Describe the Targets for the solution.
	Who in your community needs the solution? How many people are affected by your problem? How
	many could your solution impact?
	Pitch a Business plan – How will you operationalize this solution?
	What is the budget for your program?
	Who is responsible for executing the plan?
	Do you see that this a one-time investment or is it sustainable and for how long?
	Does your solution create savings? Where?
	Who are other community collaborators?
Community Resource	Community Resources?
Impact	Is this a unique approach to solving your problem?
	Has it worked other places?
	How does this improve, enhance current community resources?
Conclusion	1. End with a Motivating Conclusion.
	Drive your point home and close the presentation.
	Don't forget to effectively answer any questions the judges or audience might have.
